

PART I. RULES COMMON TO ALL AWARDS

1. The awards referred to in these notes [known as the Best All-Rounder Awards] shall be open to competition annually by all members of the CTC except where otherwise stated. Persons who become members of the CTC during the current year become eligible to compete for the awards from the date they become members.
2. All Trophies and Cups [hereinafter called Trophies] are to remain the property of West Kent CTC [hereinafter called "WKCTC"], and cannot be won outright. Each shall be held for the current year by the member to whom it is awarded by the Committee of WKCTC [hereinafter called "the Committee"].
3. All Trophies are to be awarded in January of each year.
4. The member who holds any Trophy for the time being shall be responsible for its safe custody and will receive it upon the terms and conditions set out in these rules and/or any other instructions and shall hand it over to the Secretary of WKCTC not later than 31st December next ensuing or such other date as the Secretary may require.
5. Trophies shall be presented each year at the Annual Dinner, or on such other occasion as the Committee may determine.
6. The Committee may appoint one or more sub-committees for the purpose of exercising any of their functions under these rules but the award of all Trophies and other awards in each year shall be the final responsibility of the Committee.
7. No member shall be prevented from holding two or more of these Trophies simultaneously except where they are excluded from so doing by these "Common" or "Specific" rules set out in Parts II to VIII below.
8. Where two or more Trophies have been won by the same person then they will only be given one medal, certificate or other personal award.
9. In the event of a tie in any of the competitions the Trophies shall be held for the appropriate fraction of the year by those members concerned except where otherwise stated in these rules.
10. The winner's name together with the year of the award shall be inscribed on each Trophy in such a manner as the Committee may determine.
11. Where as detailed in these rules a medal, certificate or other personal award is given, the recipient's name, year of award and the relevant competition will be inscribed on the medal, certificate or other personal award as appropriate.
12. The award of the Trophies and other awards are at the discretion of the Committee who may, if they see fit, decide not to award one or more of them in any year if, in their opinion, there is no member who merits such an award.
13. These and the rules special to each Trophy may, subject as therein provided, be amended or added to at any time by the Committee.

PART II. RULES SPECIAL TO THE GEORGE HARRISON TROPHY

1. The Trophy shall be called the George Harrison Trophy [hereinafter called the GHT] and shall be awarded to the member who obtains the highest number of points during the previous twelve months ending 31st December calculated in accordance with the scale of points set out in the Schedule to these rules [hereinafter called the "Schedule"].
2. The member who wins the Trophy each year will be given by WKCTC a suitably inscribed award. An appropriate award will be given to each of those placed second and third. A certificate will be awarded to each of the remainder of the first ten in the competition.

PART III. RULES SPECIAL TO THE INVICTA TROPHY

1. The Trophy shall be called the Invicta Trophy and shall be awarded to the member who obtains the greatest number of points in aggregate, during the three years immediately preceding it, calculated in accordance with the scale of points set out in the Schedule to these rules.
2. A member shall not be eligible for the award of this Trophy unless he or she is placed amongst the first twenty in the competition for the GHT in the third relevant year, but the Committee may, in its discretion, waive this requirement on special reason being shown.
3. The member who wins the Trophy each year will be given by WKCTC a suitably inscribed personal award. A certificate will be awarded to each of the remainder of the first five in the competition.

PART IV. RULES SPECIAL TO THE SECTION TROPHY

1. The Trophy shall be called the Section Trophy and shall be awarded to the Group whose regular members, as defined in these rules, has gained the highest total of points on ordinary Group rides and tours during the year.
2. For the purpose of this award all points gained in connection with or supporting any WKCTC competitive event, Audax Ride / Tourist Trial, Photographic / Art competition, Winged Words competition, attending the AGM or such other event as determined by the Committee, will be excluded.
3. The points gained will be allocated to the Group organising and leading the run or tour on which the points were gained. Where two or more Groups arrange and advertise in the Runs List joint runs or tours, points will be shared between those Groups on a pro rata basis based on the number of regular members attending. The Groups may submit a separate or a joint return and the points will be allocated by the Committee.
4. The Trophy shall be placed in the custody of the Secretary of the winning Group and shall be displayed on those occasions and at those functions as the Committee sees fit.
5. Nothing shall prevent the same Group holding the Trophy for any number of years whether successive or not.
6. The trophy shall be inscribed with the name of the winning Group and relevant year.

PART V. RULES SPECIAL TO THE MURIEL CUP

1. The Trophy shall be called the Muriel Cup and shall be awarded to the Lady member who obtains the highest number of points during the twelve months ending 31st December calculated in accordance with the scale of points set out in the Schedule.
2. The member who wins the Trophy each year will be given by WKCTC a suitably inscribed personal award. Certificates will be given to each of those placed second and third in the competition for the Trophy.

PART VI. RULES SPECIAL TO THE CLEVERLEY MORECROFT CUP

1. The Trophy shall be called the Cleverley Morecroft Cup, and shall be awarded to the Junior member who obtains the highest number of points during the twelve months ending 31st December calculated in accordance with the scale of points set out in the Schedule.
2. A Junior member for the purposes of these rules must be under the age of 18 on 31st December of the year in question.
3. No limitation other than age shall prevent the same Junior member from holding the Trophy for different years whether successive or not.
4. The member who wins the cup each year will be given by WKCTC a suitably inscribed personal award. Certificates will be given to each of those placed second and third in the competition for the Trophy.

PART VII. RULES SPECIAL TO THE LIONEL BLUNDELL CUP

1. The Trophy shall be called the Lionel Blundell Cup and is to be awarded to the Senior member who is an active rider with WKCTC and is adjudged to have given the most meritorious support during the year to WKCTC and in particular to its cycling activities.
2. A Senior member for this purpose is one who is at least aged 50 years on 1st January of the year in question.
3. The Trophy shall not be awarded to the same person in two successive years.
4. The winner of the Trophy shall be given a suitable personal award as the Committee may determine.

PART VIII. RULES SPECIAL TO THE HUNTER CUP

1. The Trophy shall be called the Hunter Cup and is to be awarded to the member who, although well placed in the competition for one of the WKCTC awards, has failed to gain any Trophy in the current year and whose performance during the year is, in the opinion of the Committee, most deserving of recognition by the award of this Cup.
2. This Trophy shall not be held by the same person for two successive years.
3. The winner of this Trophy shall be given a suitable personal award as the Committee may determine.

PART IX. REGULATIONS FOR THE AWARD OF POINTS

- 1) Rides leaders [in conjunction with Group Secretaries] are to make a return of points gained under [a] and [b] of the Schedule.
- 2) Organisers are to make a return of points gained under [c] and [d] of the Schedule.
- 3) The Photographic Sub Committee Chairman is to make a return of points gained under [e] and [f] of the Schedule.
- 4) The Winged Words Editor is to make a return of points gained under [g] of the Schedule.
- 5) All returns are to be made to the Registrar [in cases under Regulation 1 via the Group Secretary] who will report to the Committee [via the BAR Sub Committee]. Copies are to be provided to the BAR Chairman.
- 6) Only points duly returned as above will count.
- 7) The decision of the Committee as to what constitutes a tour is final. Recognition will not ordinarily be accorded unless:-
 - [a] It was promoted by a Group through its Secretary
 - [b] It was announced in the Runs Programme, Newsletter, Website or on the Clubroom Notice Board not less than one month before the event
 - [c] It was open to all members subject to any limit on numbers announced
 - [d] Not less than four members participated
- 8) If a member leads more rides than the number mentioned in Section [b] of the Schedule he will be credited with those which attract the greatest number of points. When a member has led more than one tour and less than four ordinary rides, individual days on the second or subsequent tour will count.
- 9) It is the Leader's responsibility to make sure that riders are current members of the CTC and to endorse the return of points if a rider recorded is not so accredited.
- 10) Members riding with more than one Group in the course of one day will not score more than the appropriate points for one day.
- 11) Riders completing half day rides, before or after events, shall score points as under Section [a] for that ride.
- 12) For interpretation, a regular rider is one who attends 17 or more ordinary day rides within the year to 31st Dec.
- 13) Except for official helpers on events, no points will be awarded in respect of journeys not undertaken on a cycle.
- 14) For Photographic & Art Competition(s), professional photographers, so claiming, will not be entitled to any win or placing points as given under [e] and [f] of the Schedule.
- 15) In cases for which these rules make no provision or where the Committee considers that points should be awarded, the Committee shall have the power to allocate points as are deemed to be appropriate.
